



FROM THE NATONAL DIRECTOR

Good day ELPA Member companies,

In the minutes of the meeting on 8th May 2015 at the ECB offices in Pretoria, section 3 (Proposals) item 3.3 read: "The name "Earthing and Lightning Protection Association", for the association was proposed."

The concept of an 'Association' was preferred allowing for a voluntary membership, and "is less prescriptive and will bring unification of the codes of practice".

With the launch of ELPA in June 2017, the razzmatazz went hand-inhand with weekly and monthly behind-the-scenes meetings trying to set up a foundation to launch ELPA.

Turning the vision into reality has been a tough job requiring perseverance, overcoming many obstacles not anticipated. 




